A Yom Kippur Letter



My precious child,

I want to wish you a gmar chasimah tova, a sweet new year, and share with you a few things that I think you need you to know.


When I look at you I see something very different than what you see when you look in the mirror. You see yourself as you are now. But when I look at you I see who you can become. My primary goal is to help you grow from where you are now to where I know you can be.

Sometimes you are already challenging yourself and pushing yourself to become that person that I created you to become. So I just watch, with great nachas, and gently guide you in that direction. I orchestrate the events and experiences of your day-to-day life to ensure the maximum possibility of your achievement of that goal.

Other times, I have to present you with challenges and hurdles in order to convert your potential greatness into actualized excellence. I know that those moments are sometimes painful, but if I don't challenge you then you will never actualize your potential. Please remember that I am closer to you during those moments than I am at any other time.

I want to tell you about one of my most important employees. He is the V.P. of Human Development. His name is Yetzer hara, the evil inclination, and he works for me 365 days a year, 24/7. If it weren't for him, you would remain a nobody forever. I have empowered him to provide you with constant assaults and to approach you with a never ending barrage of creative tactics, but they only come to challenge you to grow and improve yourself. HALACHIC INSIGHT

Practical applications for bishul part 2:

Liquid condiments which were cooked during the processing like ketchup and mustard can not be used in a klei rishon but can be used in a klei sheini.

It is permissible to add cold water to hot tea or coffee in a klei sheini or to hot soup in a klei sheini but not to a pot of hot water or soup in a klei rishon.

Coffee and tea may be prepared in the following manner: hot water should be poured from the kettle or urn (klei rishon) into a dry cup (Klei sheini). One may then add instant coffee, sugar and milk. Cold water may also be added to coffee in the keli sheini. Some observe a more stringent practice, transferring the hot water to a klei shlishi before adding any ingredients.

instant coca may be prepared the same way as coffee. Unprocessed cocoa may only be prepared in a klei shlisihi.
