Commentators explain that the report of the spies itself was appropriate. They were told to see the land and report back on the conditions of the land itself and of the people who lived there. Their task was to observe and relate what they saw. Their mistake was rendering a decision that they should not attempt to enter the land. It was not up to them to come to any final conclusions, only to report the facts.

They were wrong about the inability to conquer the land. The Almighty has the power to help against all odds. Just because in their minds they did not think it was possible for them to successfully take over the land of Israel did not mean that it was really not possible.

Very often people see factors in a situation and come to erroneous conclusions based on their perceptions. Even if someone's observations are correct, there could always be factors that he didn't take into consideration or that he was unaware of. It is a special talent to be able to reach correct decisions based on the facts. This is especially true about making judgments on other people. Some people have a strong tendency to reach negative conclusions about others that are inaccurate. Even if what you see about another person is basically true, always keep in mind that the conclusion could be wrong and the other person should still be judged favorably.

For this week when a situation comes up which can be interpreted negatively we should try to see the good in others and look to judge them favorably.

HALACHIC INSIGHT

Practical applications of borer

You may not use on shabbos a sieve, strainer, perforated spoon, vegetable peeler, salt shaker that contains rice to absorb the moisture or extracting essence from a tea bag by allowing it to drip from the bag since the tea leaves stay inside.

By dirt particles or an insect in a drink: The particle may be poured out with some liquid or removed in a spoonful of liquid.

By spoiled grapes in a cluster one may only select the fresh grapes for immediate use.

By fat attached to meat one may cut away part of the fat, leaving a thin layer attached to the meat.

Alternatively, one may remove all the fat by cutting away some of the meat along with the fat.
