

HALACHIC INSIGHT

There are instances in which one is permitted to chop a fruit or vegetable into very small pieces. One may chop fruits and vegetables into pieces using the handle of a knife or fork, this is permitted because cutting with a handle is a highly irregular manner of grinding.

Many poskim rule that the prohibition against grinding does not apply if the food is being prepared for immediate consumption. According to this view, one may cut a fruit or vegetable into very small pieces. Other poskim disagree and forbid cutting food into very small pieces even immediately before the meal. it is better to abide by the stricter version, however in cases of necessity the lenient view may be followed. There is a view that the exemption of grinding for immediate use does not extend to mashing, even in a case of necessity. therefore if food must be mashed for a baby it is preferable that one do so only with the handle of a utensil
