Rav Mordechai Kalatsky December 8, 23| 25th Kislev, 5784

AND THEY SAT DOWN TO EAT BREAD, AND THEY LIFTED UP THEIR EYES AND LOOKED,"
AND BEHOLD, A COMPANY OF YISHMEALIM CAME FROM GILAD WITH THEIR CAMELS,
CARRYING AROMATIC GUM, BALM, AND LADANUM, GOING TO CARRY IT DOWN TO EGYPT."

(Rereishis 37:25)



Rashi comments on this: Why did the Torah mention what the camels were carrying? To tell us the reward of the righteous. Those caravans usually carried only kerosene and resin used for fuel which had an unpleasant odor. But the caravan that carried Yosef to Egypt had pleasant spices.

This seems to be little consolation for Yosef. He was being sold as a slave by his brothers. How would something as minor as pleasant smelling merchandise on the caravan taking him to Egypt make a difference?

The answer is that this was a subtle hint from Hashem to Yosef. It was a message that all was not lost. Appreciate the hand of Hashem that is guiding your life and supplies you with the minor pleasures to enhance your life. This is a sign that all Hashem does is for your ultimate benefit.

This is an important lesson for anyone undergoing a difficult life situation. Upon facing painful experiences one is apt to become lost in self-pity and despair. It is easy to focus solely on what is going wrong in one's life. But try to keep your eyes open. Be aware of the positive aspects. Don't ignore anything that you could possibly appreciate. These minor pleasures are messengers from Hashem that He is with you and there is a purpose in the difficulties you are facing. Appreciate the little messages for themselves; and what is more, allow them to change your evaluation of the situation. Learn to see every situation as a means to help you reach your ultimate potential in this world.

For this week let us try to look for the positive in a frustrating situation and to realize this is for my ultimate good in allowing me to become who I can be.

HALACHA

There are four separate prohibitions related to opening sealed containers on Shabbos, and almost every type of packaging used today is subject to at least one of these prohibitions. Therefore, it is preferable that all food containers (bottles, cans, boxes, bags etc) be opened before shabbos.

The four prohibitions are: tearing which is koraya, making a new opening which is asiyas hapesach, finishing the object which is makeh bepatish and erasing which is mochik.
