(Vayikra 7:12)



When a person's life was in danger and he had a salvation he needed to bring a thanksgiving offering. The offering has with it forty loaves of bread in four different forms. One of each kind was given to the priest and the remaining thirty-six were his to eat. It had to be eaten within that day and the next night and if it was not consumed by then it could not be eaten. The reason for such a short time was to make sure he shared the bread with others and thereby publicizing the yeshua he had.

This idea of publicizing an offering is only when it comes to good fortune where a person feels deep gratitude to Hashem for what He did for him. In such a situation he shared his joy with others. A sin offering on the other hand was not publicized. When things were going wrong in someone's life it was not shared.

This should be a lesson for us when it comes to choosing topics of conversation with others. Keep the focus on the myriad amounts of kindness that I have in life. While there are definitely difficulties and a time and place to share those difficulties with a caring, sensitive listener, the main focus should be to share all the good that happens to you.

For this week, discuss one good thing that happened to you that day. It can be at lunch, dinner or shooting the breeze with a friend. This will allow us to appreciate all the good we have in our lives and become happier people.

HALACHA

After reciting Kiddush one should not leave and go outdoors before eating. This is true even if he returns immediately to eat the meal at the place where he recited Kiddush. For example, if a person recite Kiddush and did not yet begin his meal, he should not escort a guest outdoors. If, however, he left and returned immediately within a half hour, he need not repeat Kiddush.

This halcha is relevant on Succos, when people typically recite Kiddush in the succah and then wash for bread outside the sukkah before beginning the meal. Some poskim rule that one should wash his hands in the succah or drink a reviis of wine before going out to wash. Others, however rule that it is permitted to go out doors between kiddush and the meal for the purpose related to the meal. according to this view, one may leave the succah after kiddush to wash his hands for the meal.
